Llais Maternity Services Insights Report

The Llais **Maternity Services Insights Report** has provided important feedback on some of the experiences that women and families have had when using maternity services in Swansea over the last few years; all of this vital information will form part of the independent review. Alongside our thanks to Llais for developing this report, we would also like to thank all of the women who have contributed their time and their heartfelt experiences to help improve the future of maternity services.

Webinars and focus groups

In February and March 2025, we held four more webinars for women, families and any other members of the public interested in the review. The purpose of these was to explain how you can share any feedback to help to influence how maternity and neonatal service can provide the best care for women and families in the future. We have now completed our main cycle of webinars and focus groups and would like to thank everyone who attended and contributed.

 writing a detailed and
 informative report.
- The clinical review team
 have completed all of the
 main case reviews,
 evaluating all care received
 against good, and expected
 practice, in Wales and
 England.
- This will be the final newsletter of the independent review before publication. There will be a final webinar planned for contributing families when the final report is published.



What happens when the review ends

We are aware that there will be women and families who may have heard about the review but not felt at a point where they wanted to share their experience, or those that had some engagement with the review and have questions which arise after the work of the Family Engagement Team has concluded in May 2025.

The Triage/ Self referral Midwife who has supported families in giving their stories has agreed to stay on for a period of time after the report is provided. The self-referral process will remain open although will be hosted directly by the Health Board. Access to a dedicated counselling service (see Ty Ellis below) will remain open for the foreseeable future.
